Books and booze: Your Lit Crawl NYC schedule

> Because sometimes the cure for writer's block is a stiff drink. On Saturday, Sept 13, join the ranks of bookish boozehounds like Ernest Hemingway and Anne Sexton, and celebrate all things on the page or in a tumbler. Any day of the week, you can indulge at the best literary bars (http://www.timeout.com/newyork/food-drink/best-literary-bars-in-nyc-kettle-of-fish-old-town-bar-and-more)—or, for that matter, at any bar in NYC (http://www.timeout.com/newyork/bars)—but only once, at the end of summer, does your drink come with a curated dash of fiction or wedge of poetry. Lit Crawl NYC (http://www.timeout.com/newyork/books/lit-crawl-nyc), now in its seventh year, honors the spirited artistic heritage of the East Village and Lower East Side by inviting local writers and organizations to host short programs at various venues around the neighborhoods, including institutions like KGB and St. Mark's Bookshop. This year's installment features 25 events for the literature-loving reveler, from games of literary Taboo and Pictionary to a lexicological cabaret (you'll have to stop by to find out what the hell that means), plus an after party where you may end up doing shots with one of our favorite New York authors (http://www.timeout.com/newyork/books/10-new-york-authors-to-read-right-now).

Here's the full schedule for your perusal, and keep in mind, kids: This is a literary bar crawl so all events are 21 and over unless noted otherwise.

Phase 1: 6 - 6:45 pm

1. Electric Literature and Black Balloon Present Literary Taboo; Solas, 232 East 9th Street
